



Mr. Pil-Bae Song is a senior clean energy expert (consultant) of Asian Development Bank (ADB). He has over 40 years of professional experience in the energy sector with global development experience.

Mr. Song served ADB from 1996 to 2013 occupying various senior positions including Chair of Energy Committee, Director of Central and West Asia Energy Division, and Senior Advisor to Vice-President (Operations 1). From 2013 till now, Mr. Song was appointed in several positions including Visiting Professor at Korea Development Institute School of Public Policy and Management, Senior Advisor at Korea Energy Agency, Secretary General of Asia Solar Energy Forum. He also undertook a number of consulting assignments of ADB, World Bank and the Government of Korea for energy efficiency, renewable energy, and energy access.



Dr. Sangjun Lee is currently a research fellow and head of the climate policy research team at the Korea Energy Economics Institute (KEEI). He received his Ph.D. in agricultural, food and resource economics from Michigan State University.

His main field of study is climate change policy. He has published several research reports on greenhouse gas reduction policies. Especially, he participated in the working group for preparing the Intended Nationally Determined Contribution (INDC) and establishing a roadmap for GHG reduction in Korea. He also served as a professional member of the 8th National Committee on Sustainable Development and the committee on 8th Basic Plan for Electricity Supply and Demand. More recently, he participated in the process of establishing the 3rd Energy Master Plan of Korea which laid out the overall direction of Korea's energy transition.



Mr. Rizky Aditya Putra is currently working at the Jakarta-based ASEAN Centre for Energy (ACE) as Senior Officer of the ASEAN Plan of Action for Energy Cooperation (APAEC) Programme. His role is to coordinate and facilitate the implementation of the APAEC 2016-2025 in cooperation with the ASEAN Member States, ASEAN energy bodies, Dialogue Partners and International Organizations. The APAEC consists of seven (7) programme areas, namely: ASEAN Power Grid, Trans-ASEAN Gas Pipeline, Coal and Clean Coal Technology, Energy Efficiency and Conservation, Renewable Energy, Regional Energy Policy and Planning, and Civilian Nuclear energy.

He obtained his Master Degree in Oil and Gas Enterprise Management from the University of Aberdeen, United Kingdom in 2017.



Mr. Siddique Zobair served the Government of Bangladesh for 34 years in different capacity and retired in January 2020 as Additional Secretary/Member, Sustainable and Renewable Energy Development Authority (SREDA). He now serves as a panel expert of power sector in the Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources.

While in SREDA, he actively worked with the Government, international organizations, financial institutions, civil society, academia and NGO's to identify necessary interventions and prepare relevant laws, rules and policies to promote and develop renewable energy and energy efficiency activities in the country.
